Band and Choir Ensembles Creative Arts Faculty


Performance ensembles allow students the opportunity to develop their skills and broaden their repertoire of vocal and instrumental music.

The Duke of Edinburgh International Award Mr Appleby

The Duke of Edinburgh International Award is a challenge based program created to offer young people an opportunity to try something new whilst challenging themselves to achieve their goals. Young people aged 14-25 set themselves a goal to achieve in a physical activity, a skill, community service and an adventurous journey (overnight hikes). At Kingsgrove High most students start on Bronze level where they have to complete 13 hours of application in each category to achieve their goal.

The Award runs throughout the year with a Parent Information Night in Term 1 and training sessions each term to assist students with their documentation, logging their hours, training for their adventurous journey hikes and attending two overnight hikes in Term 4.
